



Broadband Office – Organization Chart






Federal Program Update

Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment Program (BEAD)

- Allocates \$42 Billion for all States and Territories
 - \$100 Million Minimum Allocation for each State and Territory
 - Second Tranche is funding is allocated based on Unserved in "High Cost" area as a percentage of total "High Cost" areas in the United States, and
 - The remainder is allocated using Unserved Alaska over Unserved total US
- Disbursement of Alaska's Allocation of the \$42 Billion
 - Alaska's allocation will be disbursed, through grants, based on percentage of locations that are
 - 1. Unserved (less than 25Mbps/3Mbps)
 - 2. Underserved (less than 100Mbps/20Mbps) and
 - 3. Unserved Community Anchor Institutions (less than 1Gbps/1Gbps)
- AK Broadband Office's Next Steps:
 - Work with Tribes, Villages, Communities, Industry, Regional Corporations, AFN, AML and others to develop and submit a Five-Year Action Plan






Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment Program


- Unserved:
 - Cannot achieve 25 Mbps Download Bandwidth (Watching a video)
 - Cannot Achieve 3 Mbps Download Bandwidth (Posting)
- Underserved:
 - Minimum 25 Mbps Download Bandwidth of 25 Mbps, but cannot reach 100Mbps
 - Minimum 3 Mbps Upload Bandwidth, but cannot reach 20 Mbps
- Served:
 - Minimum 100 Mbps Download Bandwidth
 - Minimum 20 Mbps Upload Bandwidth





























Alaska Broadband Office - Next Steps
